The gate of the carabiner should therefore be facing out (away from the participant), so the instructor can clearly see the gate of the carabiner.</li> <li>Activity/safety briefings are to be given to all participants. 'Not to touch any metal).</li> <li>Constant monitoring of participants by the instructor.</li> <li>Everything should be double checked in accordance with SOP's.</li> </ul>

					<ul> <li>In hot conditions breaks to be given where necessary for rehydration.</li> <li>Staff to be vigilant to the signs of a participants suffering from the weather and act accordingly.</li> </ul>
Lightning Storm	All that visit the site	5	3	8	Cease activities should lightening be within 2 miles (one mile per second from thunder to lightening) refer to emergency procedures to evacuate activities.
Wind	Participants & Instructors	3	3	6	<ul> <li>If winds exceed 35mph all activities to cease.</li> <li>If an evacuation of the course is needed all emergency procedures should be followed.</li> </ul>
Ill fitted personal equipment	Participants & Instructors	5	4	9	<ul> <li>All personal equipment is available in a range of sizes.</li> <li>All participant equipment is fitted and double checked by a qualified instructor.</li> <li>Instructors are trained to ERCA standards.</li> <li>If for whatever reason personal equipment cannot be worn correctly or does not fit. Then that person does not take part in any activity.</li> </ul>
